SOCIAL WORK AND THE SUSTAINABLE
DEVELOPMENT GOALS

The 26th Asia-Pacific Regional Social Work Conference Recommended Poster Presentation Guidelines (digital)

Conference subthemes:

The conference will explore the role of social work in the 2030 Global Agenda, which specifies 17 SDGs and 169 targets. Sub themes for this conference are in relation to the 4 core pillars of the Global Agenda, which include People, Prosperity, Planet, Peace & Partnership.

- **Sub theme 1: People**
 - People includes the following goals: No Poverty (SDG 1), Zero Hunger (SDG 2), Good Health and Well Being (SDG 3), Quality Education (SDG 4) and Gender Equality (SDG 5).
 - Abstracts that look at working to end poverty and hunger and strive to ensure that everyone can fulfil their greatest potential in a healthy environment; or working to eliminate all forms of inequality and discrimination to ensure that everyone's human rights are respected.
- **Sub theme 2: Prosperity**
 - Prosperity covers the following Goals: Affordable and Clean Energy (SDG 7), Decent Work and Economic Growth (SDG 8), Industry Innovation and Infrastructure (SDG 9), Reduced Inequality (SDG 10), and Sustainable Cities and Communities goals (SDG 11)
 - Abstracts that look at achieving the goal of inclusive and sustainable economic growth, employment and decent work for all; or working towards ensuring that all peoples are afforded the opportunities to live fulfilling lives and that economic, social, and technological progress is achieved sustainably.
- **Sub theme 3: Planet**
 - Planet covers the following Goals: Clean Water and Sanitation (SDG 6), Responsible Consumption and Production (SDG 12), Climate Action (SDG 13), Life below Water (SDG 14) and Life on Land (SDG 15).
 - Abstracts that look at protecting the planet by working to stop climate change and global warming. Working in response to extreme weather events, including droughts, fires and floods, and advocacy reduce our global carbon footprint so that future generations may continue to enjoy the use of the planet's resources sustainably.
- **Sub theme 4: Peace and Partnership**
 - Peace and Partnership cover the following goals: Peace, Justice and Strong Institutions (SDG 16) and Partnerships for the Goals (SDG 17). Partnership for the Goals is the cross-cutting result across all result groups.
 - Abstracts that look at working to foster peaceful and inclusive societies that are free from fear and violence; building and strengthening partnerships among people from all around the world; or building global solidarity and the participation of all countries to support the country to meet the needs of the most marginalised and disenfranchised.
